About Uppsala

Uppsala is located about 70 km north of the capital Stockholm. Since 1164, Uppsala has been the ecclesiastical center of Sweden, being the seat of the Archbishop of the Church of Sweden.

Founded in 1477, Uppsala University is the oldest center of higher education in Scandinavia.

With several unique university faculties, internationally active pharmaceutical companies, a number of government agencies and broad medical competence, Uppsala is the leading medical centre in the Nordic Region. Extensive research in information and communication technology (ICT) is also pursued here.

The Fyris river (fyrisån) neatly divides the city into two different parts: the historic quarter to the west of the river and the administrative, residential and commercial area to the east. On the western part you will find the cathedral, old streets, river views and parks. The cathedral is Scandinavia's largest church (118.70m high).

Some well-known people connected to Uppsala are Dag Hammarskjöld who was a Swedish diplomat, author, and the second Secretary-General of the United Nations, and Carl Linnaeus (1707 – 1778). Carl Linnaeus, Professor at the Uppsala University, was a Swedish botanist, physician, and zoologist who laid the foundations for the modern scheme of binomial nomenclature. Carl Linnaeus is known as the father of modern taxonomy, and is also considered one of the fathers of modern ecology.
